



## Chasing for the Northern Lights

Many visitors come to Finland with hopes of seeing the Northern Lights, which is a natural phenomenon that is also known as the Aurora Borealis.

The best place to see the Northern Lights in Finland is in the northern Lapland region, which is almost entirely located within the realm of the Arctic Circle. During the dark winter months here, when the sun rarely peaks its head over the horizon, you can expect to see the Northern Lights regularly.

Season November – March/ April

If you have never seen the Northern Lights wherever they commonly occur in the world, then chances are good that you will be amazed the first time that you lay eyes on them. Swirling shades of blue, green, and red are most common when it comes to the Northern Lights, and as one might expect, clear nights are best for viewing them. The Lapland region has about 200 nightly occurrences of this phenomenon every year. You must see it at least once in a lifetime.

Schedule (local time = GMT +2):

- Dep.time: 07:00 PM from your accommodation.
- Duration: up to 6 hours
- Return time: about 01:00 AM
- Transportation: Minibus, 8 seats, max. 7 passengers
- Distance: up to 150 km one way, depending on the cloud/weather condition.

Prices:

- Tour to chase for clear skies and the Northern Lights: 159 € (Euro) / person,
- Min 3 passengers to start a tour. / (2 or less, ask for an offer)

Prices include:

- Coffee/tea, snacks, sausages and making of a campfire.
- Thermal overall suits to put upon your own clothes.
